2023 Workshop Clinicians

Adult Choral Clinician: Jeff Faux



Jeff Faux is the Director of Sacred Arts at First Presbyterian Church in Bonita Springs, where he oversees a large program that includes ten vocal and instrumental ensembles. The choir has a recording, *Great Hymns of the Faith* available online and has performed in Florence, Italy, Barcelona, Spain, and Paris, France. In 2023, Jeff will conduct the Choir and other singers from around the United States in Dan Forrest's *Te Deum* with the Oxford Symphony in London in a series of performances in collaboration with John Rutter.

Jeff is a graduate of Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ. He served as an adjunct instructor of Music Education at Westminster Choir College and graduated from Michigan State University with a Masters in Choral Conducting and is pursuing a doctorate in Worship Studies at the Robert E.

Webber Institute for Worship Studies.

Formerly the Artistic Director and conductor of the Fort Myers Symphonic Mastersingers and the Naples Philharmonic Chorus, Jeff has collaborated with the Naples Philharmonic Orchestra, The Southwest Florida Symphony, The Gulf Coast Symphony, Opera Naples, Gulf Shore Opera, and the Charlotte Symphony. In 2010, the chorus was invited to perform with the Star Wars in Concert tour at Germain Arena. On September 11, 2011, Jeff conducted the Naples Philharmonic with the Naples Philharmonic Chorale and the Mastersingers in a concert remembering the 10th Anniversary of 9/11. Jeff made his European conducting debut in 2019 conducting the Fauré Requiem with the Orchestre Symphonique Bel'Arte of Paris at L'eglise de la Madeleine, where Fauré wrote the work.

Advanced & Intermediate Handbell Clinician: Rick Holdsworth



Rick Holdsworth has dedicated his careers to sharing music with the public, as a vocalist, instrumentalist, director, arranger, and music educator. His love of music began at an early age, and grew as a member of his high school marching band. After graduation, he began his first professional music career in the U.S. Navy. During his 30 years of service, Rick performed in, managed and directed Navy bands around the world. After retiring as a master chief, he began his second career in music ministry. For more than 20 years now, Rick has been leading an extensive music ministry, including vocal and handbell choirs of all ages and skill levels, as the Director of Music at Pine Shores Presbyterian Church in Sarasota, Florida.

A recognized expert in all facets of handbell music and operations, Rick has been an enthusiastic member of the handbell music community for nearly four decades. In 2009, Rick founded Ring Sarasota – an advanced handbell community ensemble – and continues to lead the organization as principal conductor. He has been an invited guest conductor and clinician at handbell conferences and festivals throughout the southeast, and has published handbell arrangements and orchestrations with five different music publishers to-date. His first handbell arrangement, a complete transcription of “Jupiter” from *The Planets*, was published by From the Top Music and selected for performance at Distinctly Bronze East 2015 – an event he has participated in for a decade.

Rick is an active member of the American Guild of Organists Sarasota-Manatee Chapter, the Handbell Musicians of America, the Presbyterian Association of Musicians, and the Fellowship of Methodist Musicians. When not creating handbell music, he works behind-the-scenes as the Florida Handbell Doctor repairing, adjusting, refurbishing, and cleaning handbell sets for organizations throughout the southeast.

Rick is married to Cher, and they have three grown children and five grandchildren. In his spare time, he can be found tinkering with his Lionel O-Gauge model train layout.

Youth Choral Clinician: Brian Browning

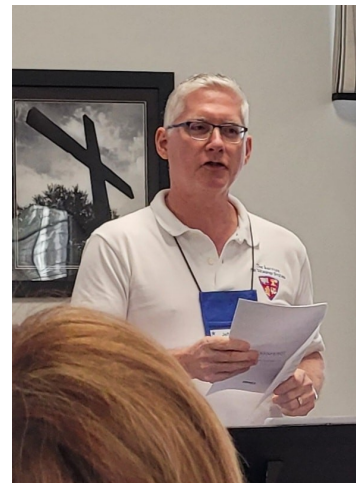


Bryan Browning, our youth choral clinician, is the Director of Music at Moore Haven Middle-High School in Moore Haven, FL, where he oversees the vocal and instrumental ensembles as well as the director of musical productions. He is a pianist, vocalist, and instrumentalist with a B.A. in Music Education from Florida Southern College in Lakeland, FL. He has been involved with The Fellowship chapter for 23 years as a camper, Youth Team member and has served as the Instrumental Ensemble conductor for many years. Bryan is an event organizer for the Glades County Season of Fine Arts. He also serves as Worship Leader at FUMC Moore Haven in Moore Haven, FL.

Youth Worship Leader: Rev. Bryant Manning



Rev. Bryant Manning is a Provisional Elder in the United Methodist Church currently serving as the Director of the Wesley Foundation at Florida State University and Tallahassee Community College as well as Trinity United Methodist Church, Tallahassee, as an Interim Associate Pastor. He is passionate about young people and their involvement with the church and helping them pursue a meaningful relationship with Jesus Christ. He has been involved with the Fellowship for nearly 10 years, serving as the preacher and worship leader for Vespers as well as an assortment of other roles. He is a vocalist, pianist, and guitarist, with both a degree in Music Performance from Florida Southern College and a Master of Divinity from Duke University's Divinity School.
